# **Teacher Report**

## Mrs. Tower - Pre-K

In April, the Pre-K children have been very keen to learn about books and stories. For literacy month, parents read stories to the class using online formats. In addition, the class took part in a virtual author visit with Mike Boldt. The children really enjoyed these visits. In class, we expanded on the children's interest in books and worked together to begin writing our own Pre-K story. The children brainstormed ideas about the story; it will be about animals at the beach and each child came up with an idea for a page of the story. With the arrival of spring weather and earth day, the children have been showing an interest in planting, bugs and the planet earth. They planted some marigold and sweet pea seeds and have been watering them and watching them grow.

Grade 1s have continued to focus on literacy and numeracy skills in the month of April. We have been doing Guided Reading, phonic spelling, sight words practice, and personal writing. # Mrs. McNeil - Grade 3

3M just finished up hearing and sound in science and we are looking forward to animal life cycles. We will be hatching chickens. The kids took part in the #kids2030challenge which promoted less single use plastic usage and creative ways to solve pollution problems. In math we are working on division. We are doing a novel study in LA - A Boy Called Bat that ties in with science. Mrs. McNeil is running code club for her class again.

### Mrs. McGuire - Grade 4

4M has spent the past month focusing on our schoolwide literacy activities. We learned about different genres, awarded trophies to our favorite books and illustrated a scene from our favorite book made entirely out of plasticine. This project was inspired by author and illustrator Barbara Reid. We also worked on opinion writing.

In math, we are learning different strategies to divide two-digit numbers by one-digit numbers.

In Science, we have been spending some time outside learning about shadows. We have also looked at opaque, transparent, and translucent materials. In recognition of Earth Day and our Waste in Our World Science unit, students turned trash into treasure! We have some students who could go into business selling thier Sea Glass necklaces and plastic water bottle bracelets. It was neat to see all their creative ideas!

In Phys.-ed we are going to start preparing for Track and Field. It is our plan to have a mini grade 4 track meet towards the end of May. More details will be sent home in the upcoming weeks.

**4.3.** Trustee- Lizz Kohle- We are working on a budget, just received the budget as of March 31, May 5th is the next trustee meeting. We need to have our budget submitted before the end of May, we are hoping the government will give us some leeway and extend it until June.

It will be a fairly balanced budget, probably getting the same amount as last year. Moving ahead the budget will mostly be similar to the previous year.

The new curriculum, will not be piloted in the Sturgeon County School Division. We figured the teachers had enough on their plates this past year dealing with Covid that we did not think it was a good to overload and stress the teachers with the changes. The Division has pulled together, working in groups, to pull curriculum and send recommendations to the government. We will get good recommendations to send.

#### 6.1. Outdoor Classroom

Jared Thompson- We have access to an outdoor classroom, it is by Half Moon Lake, it requires transportation to get there. NWR has donated resources bringing down the cost of transportation from \$7/ student down to \$3/student. The outdoor Pioneer Trail North Foundation. In the first year of operation, was able to get part time facilitators as hosts. Integral part of the system. 1,800 students made it to the outdoor classroom that year. There has been maintenance on the outdoor classroom

and the kids have been thrilled with the experience of going out there. The only problem with the program is transportation. Will it be funded next year?

Lizz Kohle- at this time we do not know, have not heard anything about it.

Jared Thompson- Teachers being involved in this program is essential to make it work. We would like to know who got to use the outdoor classroom.

Mrs. McEachren- Patricia Gagnon, she was part of the pioneer trail Foundation. Grade 3 class has attended and she has been a huge proponent of the outdoor classroom.

Lizz Kohle- Can you talk to your administration about this to see if they can help individual schools? With cutbacks always, but maybe there is some way they can help. I will bring it to the Trustee board.

Jared Thompson- There is nothing cheaper than Nature.
