Place Value: Up to the thousands, use base10 blocks, counting, digital resources. Comparing and ordering numbers: Greater than, less than, equal to (up to 1000)

Strong and Stable Structures: Different structures and their utility, identifying shapes within structures, researching famous structures around the world, creating structures to solve problems.

Social Studies

Countries around the world (food, traditions, languages, clothing, healthcare, etc.) Trade, goods and services.

Phys. Ed

Basketball: Dribbling, passing, shooting, defending, movement skills, basketball games.

Mrs. McGuire/Ms. Hand Grade 4

This is what 4H and 4MS are up to this for the month. We are going to incorporate the Winter Olympics as a theme across all subjects.

In each subject this is what students will be doing:
