

Funding and requirements

It is important to note that currently, the Alberta Government only funds half time Kindergarten.

This potential full-time option is a cost to parents and comes with no additional supports in the classroom.

Parents who choose to enroll children will be required to pay a fee; maximum **\$350/per month.** Higher enrollment reduces cost.

Parents are encouraged to volunteer at least two afternoons each month.

The program requires a minimum number of registrants to make the program viable and there will also be a cap on enrollment to provide the necessary value to students. The importance of exploratory learning cannot be underestimated. Providing opportunities to explore and learn through play is crucial for healthy brain development and socialemotional well-being. As kids follow their curiosity and try new things, they build strong neural connections that will play a key role in learning and behavior throughout life. And, equally important—exploratory learning is kid-driven and profoundly fun." (Galileo Learning LLC, 2021)

Eligibility

Children must be five years old on or before December 31, 2024 and live within the school's attendance area to be eligible for Kindergarten Programs.

Students should be able to independently dress themselves, use the washroom, and listen to directions as no additional supports will be available other than the teacher.

Completed registrations are due to the school by May 30, 2024.








April is Month of the Military Child!





Capital Plan: 2024-2027

We are excited to announce the Division's Three Year Capital Plan, which is now ready for review and submission to Alberta Education. This strategic plan, shaped in collaboration with community members and stakeholders, outlines the funding and development of future projects, including new schools, additions, modernizations, replacements, and other solutions. It addresses key needs such as building conditions, community renewal, efficiency, enrolment pressures, functionality, programming, and health & safety. At the March 20th Public Board Meeting, the Board of Trustees approved *Board Policy* 110: *Welcoming and Inclusive, Safe and Healthy Environments.* This policy, part of our ongoing review process, has been updated to more broadly encompass all members of our school community, including volunteers, in line with our commitment to equity, diversity, inclusion and human rights.

Significant updates include the enhancement of Policy 110 to foster environments free from harassment, bullying, discrimination and violence. Additionally, Administrative Procedure AP711 has been revised to align with these policy updates, ensuring a safe and respectful atmosphere for everyone in the Sturgeon Public School Division. Furthermore, a new Administrative Procedure, AP717, focusing on Workplace Violence and Harassment, has been established to reinforce our dedication to maintaining a secure and welcoming environment.
